A Momentous Year for Wexford Handball

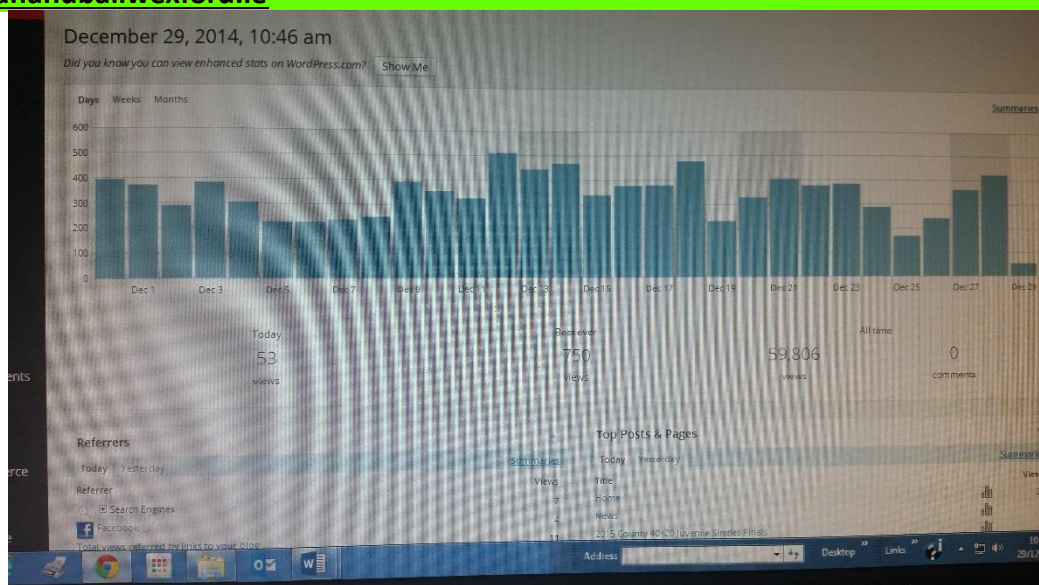
2014 proved to be a terrific year for handball in Wexford as magnificent on court achievements by our players and the high profile launch of our website combined to give the sport a further massive boost to its popularity.

Our history and our tradition have usually helped to ensure generational success in Wexford but the creation of our website has added huge momentum to the development of the game in the county, as members and parents become acutely aware of the massive exposure their involvement can now receive. A game that has created many outstanding sportsmen and women in Wexford has, at long last, a publicity platform that is completely within our control. Of course we still need the papers and the radio but the website gives us the opportunity to publicise our activities and achievements to a much wider audience and to do so in a manner entirely commensurate with our thinking.

Notwithstanding the above however it would be a major mistake if clubs were to sit back and expect the website to do all the work and on that basis I urge all units in Wexford to appoint a PRO who will engage with the local notes and local newsletters in a way that will ensure the non-playing public becomes aware of what is happening in handball, especially within their own local communities. Despite the large increase in the numbers now playing and the coverage provided by the People and Echo groups of newspapers as well as South East Radio, we are still falling well short when it comes to letting our friends and neighbours know about our achievements. This is a false modesty and relegates handball to the 'unimportant also ran' category of sports in many people's eyes.

Our target audience must always be the non-playing public, as it's from there that any additional growth in our membership will emerge. In that context the website can indeed play a major part in promoting our games and our activities and after a year when the handballers of the county performed with such distinction, that is the very least they deserve.

The launch of our website was preceded by hundreds of hours of preparatory work but when it was unveiled at White's Hotel, Wexford on Thursday 17th July, the general consensus by all who were present was that it had been well worth the effort. As a website gaahandballwexford.ie is intended to be both informational and educational and I do believe it is achieving both of these objectives in its early stages. Much remains to be done before it can be considered to be completely representative of what we are trying to do in Wexford, but used correctly, I am convinced it has the potential to be the best recruitment and development tool the sport has ever had here in the south east.

It has long been the ambition of everyone connected with the game in the county to have our own website and it is beyond question that the profile and popularity of the sport has increased immeasurably now that a dedicated handball site, constantly updated, has become available. Viewing figures are simply astonishing, with over 59,000 viewings since July and current daily averages of close to 500. An analysis of those figures provides irrefutable evidence that people want to, not just check on their fixtures and results, they also want to read about what else is happening in the handball world.

We acknowledge the incompleteness of records in our Archives and other sections, but we do absolutely recognize the importance of this and will work on updating it as soon as humanly possible.

The attendance at our launch included GAA Handball National Manager, John Kelly, Leinster President Seamus Reade, Vice President Liam Mahon, Administrator Pat Ryan, Treasurer Joe Masterson, Communications Officer Patsy Dowling and Wexford County GAA Board Secretary Margaret Doyle. We were greatly honoured that they took the time to be with us on this most important of nights and their presence added considerable prestige to the entire occasion.

All Ireland 60x30 Runners-up

Although 11 All Ireland titles were won in the 60x30 court another few got away in a season which saw 24 Leinster titles come to the county. The extent of the provincial success was reminiscent of the record years of 2000 and 2001 when the rising tide that was Wexford handball caused all those representing the county to lift their game to unprecedented heights. On this occasion several were unlucky not to complete the job but many will return again next year determined to atone. Amongst those who came up a little short was Paul Lambert, St. Josephs who is surely due a change of fortune following another unexpected reverse in the Junior Singles final. Earlier he had turned in a number of brilliant performances including an absolute exhibition against Brendan Burke, Kilkenny in the Leinster final at Garryhill and while it is a difficult title to win, it is by no means beyond him.

We think too of Gavin Buggy, St. Josephs who ran up in both 35 singles and doubles finals and John Roche who suffered a similar fate in Silver Masters B. For Stephen Murphy, Castlebridge, the long wait for that elusive All Ireland medal goes on following defeat in the GMBS final. For these and the others who finished second best in 2014, we are equally proud of their achievements.

60x30 Nationals

While these were not as populated as we would like to see and questions remain as to the optimum format of the competitions, our players again made their mark by winning a number of grades.

Miley Connors and Michael Goggins took the Men's C Doubles and Glen Murphy and Daniel Kavanagh won the Boys 13 and under and 15 and under, while partnering Jack Holden, Kilkenny and Sean Kerr, Tyrone respectively.

I have grave reservations as to the future of these competitions if the best players from different counties are allowed come together to make a partnership. Surely it's enough that the best players win the singles events, without paving the way for them to win the doubles as well. A sure fire way to sound the death knell of any tournament is to introduce terms and conditions which predetermine the outcome!

All Ireland 40x20 Champions

As usual the 'small' court proved difficult for our players with only a few managing to win All Ireland titles. The reasons for this are only partly historical because while our players do embrace 40x20 in a very meaningful way, there can be no doubt that our style of play can sometimes mitigate against us when we are faced with difficult, rather than superior, opponents. Many of our more established players play 60x30 handball in the 40x20 court and consequently attach insufficient importance to shot selection in the tighter space. Nonetheless we have demonstrated on numerous occasions that we are good enough to win in this court, but we do need to think a lot more about this code before we can become a power.

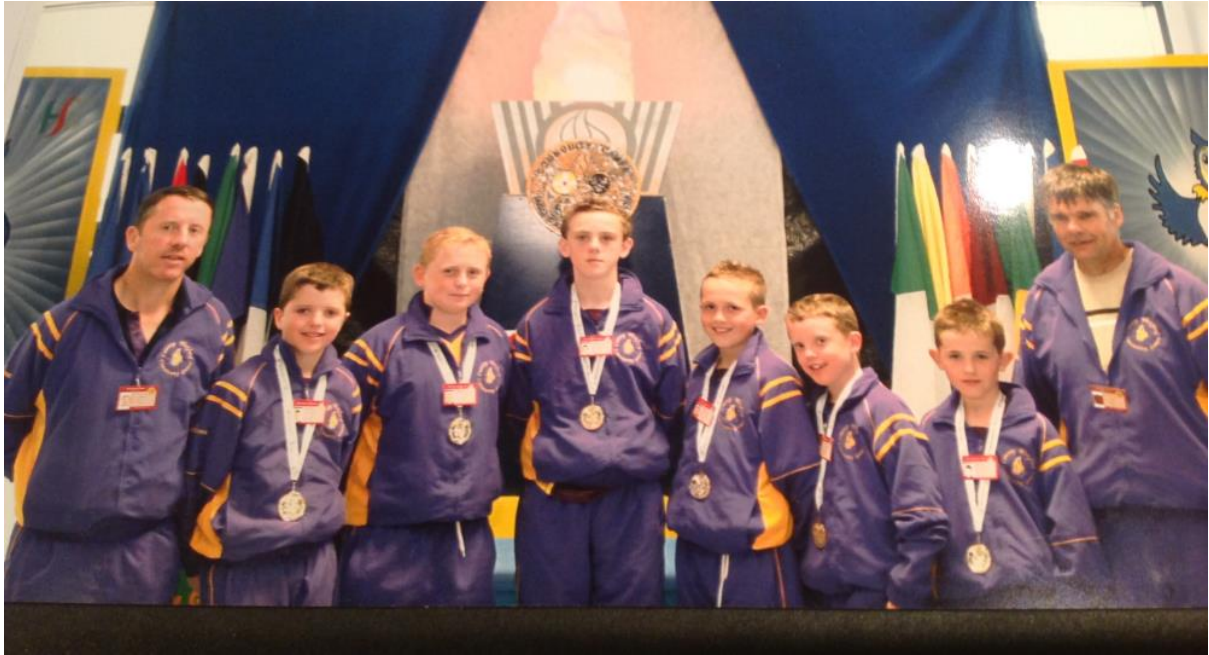
Daniel Kavanagh continued his progress by winning competitions in England and Belgium while a number at St. Joseph's players also enjoyed success in the UK event.

County Championship Programme

A look at the results document will give some indication as to the huge programme of domestic championships and competitions run in 2014. This is very challenging for all concerned and could not be undertaken without the cooperation of the clubs and the players. We must continue to do this however as the county championships are of critical importance to handball in Wexford and indeed to a great many of the players who participate in them.

Ten clubs shared 23 county 60x30 adult titles with Kilmyshall on 5 leading the way from Barntown, Castlebridge and St. Mary's with 3 apiece. Somewhat remarkably 13 of the 14 active clubs visited

New county championship structures

While our new championship structures have yet to be approved there is little doubt they have completely revitalised our domestic programme and I am confident the changes will be approved by Convention on Monday. The playing of all championships on a league basis has led to increased interest in our competitions right across the board and the additional matches generated have benefited the players greatly. Feedback from the county 60x30 season was incredibly positive and the record number of provincial titles won later on, added weight to this assertion. The recent 40x20 championships mirrored the big court for excitement and surely this is the way to go in the future.

Coaching

It is a matter of real regret to me that coaching has proved such a problem in Wexford. With other progressive counties finding people to take on this role and becoming active within the role, here in Wexford we cannot even fill the position. It appears as if those who do coach will only coach a select few within their own clubs and are not prepared to lend a hand outside of that narrow perspective.

Clubs have a responsibility to fill all county committee positions and I hope that will happen tonight.

Hardball

The decision to increase the promotion of hardball is, in my opinion, incomprehensible in the extreme. At a time when our annual clár is simply crammed with little or no room for manoeuvre, we find additional time being made available for this ancient code.

In persisting with the playing of hardball competitions we are merely paying tribute to a ancient code, not to the game. What other national organisation runs championships to commemorate a ball! If this is about history then why is the GAA not running a separate championship for those who wish to play with the ball that was used 50 years ago? Why? Because hurling and football has evolved to the extent that the game itself is bigger than the ball.

In my opinion handball has no place in a modern Ireland proliferated by championships and competitions. Is our pandering to the past a sign we are afraid to face the future?

History should be about the game, not about the ball.

Handball's contribution to the GAA Family of Sports

From time to time we hear of plans to fully integrate handball into the GAA and of course we wonder what that actually means. I suspect it means different things to different people.

The GAA at the highest level needs to identify (for itself) what it is that handball can contribute to the organisation as a whole. We all accept that the very nature of our sport (individual rather than team) means we can never be compared to hurling, football and camogie when it comes to broad public appeal, but surely within the Gaelic Athletic Association there is room for a sport that caters for individuals rather than the concept of group activities. Handball is not an alternative to hurling, football and camogie, but it is an alternative to non GAA sports such as tennis, squash, racquetball, golf and many other games that take people away from the GAA. The more people join the GAA the stronger the movement becomes and if the oft mentioned 'GAA Family of Sports' is to mean what it says, then handball has an important role to play within the organisation.

If the GAA is serious about its own vision of what the future holds, then they must see a safe and solid place for handball within that vision (at that table) and that means identifying the benefits of having people joining the GAA to play handball and selling that to their members enthusiastically and positively. Far too many so called Gaels pass within feet of handball courts each evening to get to their playing pitch without as much as a sideways glance.

I encourage the GAA to embrace handball for what it is – a one size fits all sport, catering for those who do not participate in the mainstream GAA sports of hurling, football and camogie. A GAA sport that provides activities for people of all ages and abilities and in essence a sport that caters for the entire family. What greater qualification could possibly be needed in order to be a valuable member of the GAA Family of Sports!

Officers Training

The growth in those playing the game has not been matched by a growth in those willing to become officials and I firmly believe that we as an organisation are responsible for that situation. I have long urged officialdom in higher bodies to address this matter before it's too late but sadly the emphasis appears to be on players rather than on officials. I see no evidence at all that our governing body is even interested in discussing this, much less doing something about it. No wonder then that players rather than County Boards are consulted when opinions are sought. Again I appeal to GAA Handball to convene a forum for officials so that the extent of the problem can be measured and rectified.

In any event I am proposing we run our own Officials Night in 2015 so that Club Chairmen and other officials can be brought into the fold.

Sponsorship

Now that our website is up and going the time is right for us to check out potential sponsors for our championships. For the first time ever we are in a position to give exposure to businesses who

support us and we can offer a reasonable package if the right deal is on offer. I suggest we discuss this in February so we have some idea as to what can be on offer.

Proposed Amnesty

In view of the fact that a few people got caught out by the fixtures being on the website, and consequently were 'no shows' for their games, I am recommending we adopt a sympathetic position regarding their plight and declare a once off amnesty. This to apply to all who erred throughout 2014 and to be agreed on the strict condition that it would not be repeated.

I also recommend that all court fees and no show fees be paid in the normal way but that the ban on these players competing in 2015 be set aside.

Juvenile Committee

2014 saw our Juvenile Committee take its first steps and I would like to thank Secretary Barry McWilliams for his work during the year. This is a big and at times difficult job requiring fairness and objectivity and Barry demonstrated both throughout the past 12 months.
